SELECTION OF THE HOUSEHOLD: Stands versus Households

Households are DEFINED as a group of persons who live together, and who eat together three times a week or more, or a single person who lives alone. HOWEVER, in this study we are interested in ALL HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS aged 18 OR ABOVE, living on the demarcated stand.
